



Regulatory Quarantine Biosecurity Requirements

- Quarantine REQUIRED Biosecurity
 - NO horse is to leave the designated premises. Violations and penalties may be assessed by facility management for non-compliance.
 - Horses shall not be changing stalls without prior approval from the managing veterinarian or facility manager.
 - All personnel entering and exiting premises must utilize footbaths and hand sanitizer.
 - No sharing of personnel between other equine premises.
 - No sharing of equipment between horses without cleaning and disinfecting between use.
 - Contact with each individual horse should be restricted to one individual. Use hand sanitizer after handling the quarantined horse(s).
 - Absolutely no dogs moving around quarantined premises or within 35 feet of quarantined horses at any time during quarantine period.
 - All temperatures shall be monitored and recorded **twice daily** — morning and evening, and taken prior to any medications and taken after a horse cools out from exercise.
 - Any temperatures over **101.5°F** must be reported to the treating veterinarian.
 - Horses receiving nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) such as phenylbutazone (bute), flunixin (Banamine), or firocoxib (Equioxx/Previcox) must be reported to CDFA, and any temperature at or above **101.0°F** in these horses must be reported.
 - All horses will be monitored for abnormal clinical signs and any clinical signs shall be immediately reported to the treating veterinarian.
 - Appointments with farriers and non-emergency medical care (i.e. chiropractor, acupuncture, massage etc.) should be postponed until quarantine has been released. If appointments are required during quarantine, veterinarian or facility manager approval is required.
 - Use of fans and misting equipment should be discontinued to prevent increasing airborne transmission and aerosolization of virus.
